Good morning, Northside Family.

Our midweek service this week will be on Tuesday as opposed to our regular gathering on Wednesday. This has become an annual schedule change for us to allow all of us to come together during the week, but allow extra time with family on Thanksgiving Eve. The 10:30 a.m. morning class *will* meet on Tuesday, then that evening at 6:30 p.m. all adults and children will meet together in the Worship Center for a time of thanksgiving reflection.

This evening at 6:00 p.m. at the Butler Auditorium on the campus of Benton High School, the Saline County Ministerial Alliance will host the annual Community Thanksgiving Service. Last year, we were privileged to host the service in our Worship Center. This evening's service will include **Jimmy Mitchell**, our Worship Minister, leading worship and **Fernando Toledo**, our Hispanic Minister, giving one of four Thanksgiving-themed devotional messages. Fernando will speak on "Giving Thanks for Divine Revelation" based on Matthew 11.25. The annual Community Thanksgiving service provides a wonderful opportunity to come together with other believers in and offer gratitude to God for his kindness toward us.

This week, I came across a couple of suggestions I've found helpful this week. The thrust of the advice had to do with beginning each day with a positive spirit of gratitude for God's blessings. The three suggestions went like this: (1) First thing each morning, make up your bed – it helps you accomplish something before the day begins and puts you in a "winning" spirit of accomplishment; (2) On that freshly made bed, read Scripture – before turning on the TV, checking emails, scanning websites, orient yourself to the truth of God and his good guidance and direction; (3) Make a list of three things you're thankful for – write out three specific blessings from God that have positively impacted your life and offer a prayer of thanksgiving to God.

This week, those three simple suggestions to start the day have been very helpful. It helps center our minds to begin the day on God's truth and blessings and orients us to an attitude that the challenges of the day can be tackled. Perhaps this week, being the week of Thanksgiving, would be a perfect time for you to begin each day with these three suggestions. Try it! Trust me, you'll find it helpful.

Among the multitude of blessings in my life, one I dare not take for granted is you – my church family. As your Preaching Minister, I am incredibly grateful for your patience, your encouragement, your passion to walk as Jesus did, your commitment to impact your community for good, and your love for Jesus and the Good News. Thank you for being you! And thank you for loving and encouraging me.

"Shout with joy to the LORD, O earth! Worship the LORD with gladness. Come before him, singing with joy. Acknowledge that the LORD is God! He made us, and we are his. We are his people, the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving; go into his courts with praise. Give thanks to him and bless his name. For the LORD is good! Hispanic Happenings with Fernando

"If God wants to perfect you, there is no better time to do it than through a storm"

It was night, complete darkness, the wind became angry, the waves of the sea shook, the water hit the disciples' faces and going into the boat, the disciples looked for something to hold on to, they couldn't see anything, the only thing they knew is they were going to die while they were flooded with a feeling of great fear. Suddenly, in the distance they saw something or someone approaching, I think it must be something bright because everything was dark. A ghost? They did not know it at first, and they were filled with more fear.

Have you found yourself in this situation? Or are you currently in this situation? Have you thought like the disciples that this is the end? In life there are storms like the storm that Jonah faced, but there are also storms that perfect you like these disciples of John 6:16. Matthew 14:22 tells us that it was Jesus who sent his disciples to the other side of the sea—the storm they are going through was within the will of God. Sometimes God is going to allow us to go through storms, and He knows we will pass through them, because He wants to perfect our faith, our trust, our dependence on His power and not ours. When the waves lashed against the boat and the disciples had exhausted their strength and resources, then the Lord manifested himself in surprising ways, on that occasion walking on what for the disciples was their terror, the sea.

For those of us who love and fear God, everything that happens to us happens within His embrace. Nothing overlooks the Lord's eye. He looks at us when we have a sunny day, but also when we are in the middle of storm.

When you go through a storm, ask yourself if it is to correct you because of your decisions, or is to perfect you to God's will? If it is to correct you like Jonah, do what he did, repent and ask God's forgiveness and the storm stopped. But if it is to perfect you, tell Him, "Lord I am troubled, do not take off the storm without first having perfected myself in it because I am sure that you are working in my life." When one reaches that point, the Lord of the sea manifests in surprising ways to calm the storm and take you to the beach where you can step on firm ground for Him.
