Quick, thinking about your closest friends, are they more or less like you (income, type of work, educational level, age, hobbies, interests, race, ethnicity, primary language spoken in the family)? For most of us, we tend to gravitate to people a lot like ourselves, or at least that we perceive who are not that different from us. Even within our extended families, we may joke about that one strange uncle whose idiosyncrasies make for great stories, but with whom we really don't understand nor choose to spend much time – because he is different from us.

Tonight many of the LIFE Groups will be learning from Jesus' Parable of the Compassionate Samaritan. Jesus' story reminds us of how we tend to prefer contact with people who are not too different than we think we are, and go out of our way to avoid them.

For the past five weeks, each Sunday we have really been focusing on the mission God has given Northside and ways as a church we can support it. Today, one great way is through generously giving monetarily to help fund ministry throughout Africa, and in Lithuania, Romania and the U.S.

Missionaries are challenged to do this every day. So should we. After all, we each are also on mission for God.
